The Dyslexia Association of Ireland (DAI) is committed to respecting your privacy, and to complying with all applicable data protection and privacy laws. We know that our members and clients like to be aware of what we do with their personal data. Therefore, the objective of this policy is to inform you how we handle your personal information, and sets out the basis on which any personal data we collect from you or you provide to us will be processed by us.

We collect information about individuals (“Data”) when they become members, use our services and our website. This privacy policy describes how we collect, use and disclose Data. This privacy policy applies to personal information we hold about individuals. It does not apply to information we hold about companies and other organisations.

We take the privacy of your personal information very seriously and will only use your personal information in accordance with the current data protection law in the Republic of Ireland and this privacy policy.

Any personal information you give to us is used for internal business purposes only. We will:

- Obtain and process (use) your information fairly and with your consent;
- Make you aware of all purposes that we intend to use your data for;
- Keep your information only for one or more specified and lawful purposes;
- Process personal information only in ways compatible with the purposes for which it was given to us initially;
- Retain it no longer than is necessary for the specified purpose or purposes;
- Protect personal information by reasonable security safeguards against loss, theft, misuse or unauthorised access.

#### **How we use information you have provided to us**

Any information you provide to us is used for the following:

- To enable us to provide you with the information and/or support services which you have requested from us.
- To process payments for membership or services you have requested from us.
- To keep you informed on our activities and updates in relation to dyslexia.
- To let you know ways in which you can support our campaigns and fundraising.
- To communicate with you in relation to your membership of DAI.
- To communicate DAI messages to you through other media channels.

#### **How we protect your information**

We implement a variety of security measures to maintain and safeguard personal information you have provided to us. This applies to data in both hard and soft copy. We use secure, encrypted and password protected computers and servers, and store hard copy data

securely. We have a detailed Retention Policy in place which guides confidential destruction of data no longer required.

The nature of the internet is such that we cannot guarantee or warrant the security of any information you transmit to us via the Internet will be 100% secure. However, DAI takes, and will continue to take, all reasonable steps (which includes relevant technical and organisational measures) to guarantee the safety of the data you provide to us and we will only use the data for the intended purpose.

### **Using our website**

DAI will collect no personally identifying information about you when you visit our website unless you choose to provide that information to us. The information we collect depends on what you do when visiting our website. We may collect information about your computer, including where available your IP address, operating system and browser type, for system administration and to report aggregate information on our website users. This is statistical data about our users' browsing actions and patterns, and does not identify any individual.

Our website (dyslexia.ie) uses cookies. The purpose of the cookies is solely to assist us in redesigning our website to ensure we provide relevant information in an easily accessible format. For example, via analytics cookies we collect anonymised data on our website to help us understand how people use our website and to enable us to make improvements to the site. Please see below for our Cookie Policy.

### **Cookies Policy**

Cookies are small files that a site or its service provider transfers to your computer's hard drive through your web browser (if you allow it) that allows the sites or service providers systems to recognize your browser and capture and remember certain information. We use cookies to help us compile anonymous data about website traffic and site interaction so that we can offer better site experiences and tools in the future. Our website (dyslexia.ie) uses analytics to gather anonymous statistics about visitors to the site and which pages are visited. Please note that cookies don't allow us to gain control of your computer in any way. They are strictly used to monitor which pages you find most useful so that we can provide a better experience for you.

If you prefer, you can choose to have your computer warn you each time a cookie is being sent, or you can choose to turn off all cookies via your own browser settings. Like most websites, if you turn your cookies off, some of our services may not function properly.

### **Do we disclose any information to outside parties?**

We do not sell, trade, or otherwise transfer to outside parties your personally identifiable information. This does not include trusted third parties who assist us in operating our

website, conducting our business, or servicing you, so long as those parties agree to keep this information confidential as part of their contract with DAI.

There are some situations where DAI may be required by law to disclose information, e.g. child protection concerns or illegal activity.

Non-personally identifiable visitor information may be provided to other parties for marketing, advertising, or other uses. For example, we may disclose the total number of visits to our website.
